QUESTION ONE (30 Marks)

Keenly read the Hypothetical Problem below and answer the questions that follows.

Howard Banneker Holdings has bought a 100 hectares freehold property at paradise Bay in far North Queensland. The property had until recently operated as a Cattle station. It has been partially cleared and is Zoned rural. The property sits behind Paradise Bay Beach and includes an intact wetland that is considered to be an endangered regional Ecosystem. The reminder of the uncleared parts of the property are Rainforest.

The property is surrounded on three sides by Natural Park that forms part of the Wet Tropics World Heritage area. The uncleared area of the property forms significant Habitat for the endangered species, including Cassowaries, Mahogany gliders and stream-dwelling rainforest frog species. The only road to into the property is single lane dirt road that goes through 15 km of National Park. The nearest existing Town is some 30 kilometers inland. The Town is struggling since sugarcane prices declined and it is looking to expand Economic opportunities for her residents. The access to paradise Bay outside the National Park is through a road that goes through the residential area of Tinfish Bay, a small coastal Town.

Howard Banneker holdings is planning to build a major Tourist development at Paradise Bay. It wants to clear the remaining parts of the property to build residential suburbs, Tourist facilities and other recreational facilities such as Golf Courses and swimming pools. It plans to build at least Four Five Star Resorts along the beachfront area. It is estimated the proposal could result in over 4,000 people moving into the area.
